Admission Prices and Receipts

The board believes that charging a fee for admission to athletic events where the public is invited to attend is appropriate. Therefore, the office of Superintendent is authorized to develop and administer appropriate procedures for collecting fees including planning, selling and accounting for tickets, depositing the proceeds, supervising the public and providing for the safety and security of the participants and facilities. Further, the Board believes that proceeds collected from the public should be credited to the appropriate district athletic funds for use in supporting the athletic program. The business office is directed to credit all gate receipts and proceeds from athletic events to the Special Revenue Fund #290, Student Body Funds. The credited proceeds are segregated into two separate accounts; 75% gate receipts and 25% gates receipts. The business office is then authorized to transfer the 75% gate receipts to the admissions line item in the general fund to help offset athletic costs.

The Board directs the office of Superintendent to develop rules and procedures pertaining to this policy that sets the prices of admission and regulates all complimentary passes.

1. The admission price for varsity football, volleyball, basketball, and wrestling will be set by the Board each year.
2. Culver School District residents showing valid proof of 60 years of age or more may be admitted without charge.
3. The District may provide, as part of the employee's compensation package, free or reduced admission to curricular and extra-curricular events where admission is normally charged. This benefit may be provided for employees, and in some circumstances, for members of the employee's family. Such a benefit is provided to promote employee participation in, and knowledge of, curricular and extra-curricular activities, to increase informal communication between employees and students, parent and the community and to provide/supplement general supervision and oversight of such activities.

Free or reduced admission may also be provided for board members in order to offset what would otherwise be an expense incurred in the course of fulfilling duties as a board member. Such reimbursement encourages attendance at events and benefits the district by 1) providing Board members with direct knowledge of District curricular and extra-curricular activities, 2) increasing opportunities for informal communication between board members and employees, students, parents and community members, 3) allowing board members to better understand the breadth and value of District activities offered, and 4) providing visible support for school activities. Encouraging board member attendance at such activities ultimately results in better informed board members and better board policy decisions.
